

By now all have heard of the data breach at Equifax. We have a list of things you can do to help alleviate any fear of your information being used fraudulently:

- Go to www.equifaxsecurity2017.com to check whether you are one of the 143 million people whose data may have been compromised
- Set fraud alerts – all bureaus
 - Trans Union (800) 680-7289
 - Experian (800) 301-7195
 - Equifax (800) 525-6285
- Monitor credit activity (www.annualcreditreport.com, etc.)
- Reset account passwords, PIN codes and other log-in credentials on financial accounts that may be vulnerable.
- Establish multiple-authentication protocols for financial accounts and email, when possible
- Establish credit monitoring service offered through Equifax* or one of the other service providers
